Dear Mayor and Council:

The Longlac Chamber of Commerce has been asked to enquire about making the crossing of highway 11, which passes directly through the town of Longlac, much safer for pedestrians, cyclists and local traffic.

The current speed limit of 70 kilometers per hour makes it very difficult for some of our citizens to feel safe enough to cross the highway without fear of being struck by a vehicle.

We, as well as many residents are very concerned for their safety and are requesting that the speed limit be reduced from 70 kph to 50 kph on the stretch of highway 11 which runs through our town. We would also like to see a flashing amber light at both the Forestry Road and Moose Road crossings. Furthermore a no-passing zone should be implemented on the same stretch of highway to increase the safety of both local motorists and pedestrians.

We know that safety is also important to you and look forward to swift action on this problem before we have an unfortunate accident. We look forward to hearing your response.
